APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Livingston/Turner moved and seconded a motion to approve the Minutes of June 20, 2018 as presented. Motion carried.

Terry Stamm, Dunn County Solid Waste Recycling Board Representative reported:

- We discussed vision planning for the newly proposed Solid Waste and Recycling Transfer Station.
- We discussed an updated fee schedule for items that the public will be charged for in the near future.
- We discussed the purchasing of a skid steer needed for operations at the transfer station in Menomonie.
- We discussed trading in our present loader to purchase a new one that will better fulfill the needs at the transfer station.
- We reviewed a proposed draft of the 2019 budget.

In addition, Patricia received a letter from the State Trust Fund Loan Program stating that the Loan application to Purchase a Skidsteer in the amount of \$40,000 received preliminary approval and has been forwarded to the Office of the Attorney General for legal review. Upon receiving legal approval, the application will be placed on the agenda for consideration at the next available meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Public Lands.

In addition, review the 2018 Budget numbers for a part-time police officer. Motion carried.

Discussion/Action Purchase of Additional Water Meters

Livingston/Turner moved and seconded a motion to approve the purchase of 18 additional meters from Metering and Technology in the amount of \$3,996.00. Motion carried.

Citizen's Forum - (Public Input)

Damien Montoya, 200 Lincoln Street, spoke to the Board regarding having a group home to be located at this address.

The requirement of opening a Group Home in a R-1 District will be reviewed.

Chad Eggleston, 220 South Holly Avenue Apartment #23 spoke to the Board regarding a Wolf Hybrid dog.

Chad Weinberg reported that a Wolf Dog Hybrid is not allowed in the Village per Village Ordinances.

Communications & Miscellaneous

Business as Permitted by Law

Patricia Hahn reported that she received final approval for the State Trust Fund Loan in the amount of \$40,000 for the Skidsteer purchase. Paula Turner report that TID monies can be used for other this such as traffic control signs etc.

Mark Levra reported:

1) Funds were raised from a School Civics Project by the Class of 2022 in the amount of \$2074.03. This money is to be used to replace the East and West

Village Entrance Signs. The sign cost is \$2074.00. Mr. Levra would like to purchase plaques to put on each sign stating "Signs provided by the "Class of 2022".

2) The Village hall parking lot will be seal coated in the amount of \$3,350.00. Funds are in the 2018 Village Budget: Hall Sealcoat Account; \$2000.00 and Village Hall Maintenance Account; \$1350.00.

3) The Village Park Rental Policy is in need of updating to add: "The Disposal of more than (10) 55 gallon trash bags of garbage will be the responsibility of the renter". This will be discussed at the upcoming 2019 Property & Finance Committee Budget Meeting.

Terry Stamm reported that the Solid Waste fees have been increased at the Dunn County Solid Waste sights and are now in effect.

Discussion/Action 2018 Village Park Maintenance Projects

Abraham/Livingston moved and seconded a motion to approve the 2018 Village Park Maintenance Project List as presented and forward to the County. Motion carried.

Stamm/Kipp moved and seconded a motion to approve creating a Walking/Bike Trail from the East & West (Menomonie Street/HWY 12) and from the North and South (Holly Avenue/HWY H) in cooperation with Dunn County. Motion carried.

The community center room is available for small groups and parties up to 48 people.

Rental rates are as follows:

- \$25.00 up to 2 hours or 15 guests
- \$50.00 up to 4 hours or 15 guests
- \$75.00 up to 6 hours or 25 guests
- \$100.00 up to 8 hours or 45 guests

A discounted rate of \$15.00 will be available for senior citizen events not to exceed two hours.

Confirmation of your event date will be made after receipt of rental fees. Please contact the Village Hall at 715-879-5011 or email info@elkmound.org to reserve your date.

Please understand you are renting the community center portion only. As this building is combined with the Library, there may be other activity at the Library during their open hours.

Facility provides restrooms, tables and seating up to 45 people, garbage and recycling receptacles, TV with hookups for presentations. Kitchen facilities include refrigerator, sink and counter area and electrical outlets.

SCHOOL CROSSINGS

Please be mindful of crossing guards and for all pedestrian traffic by marked crossings.
