VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may submit a request to vote an absentee ballot to their municipal clerk. A qualified elector is any U.S. citizen, who will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day, who has resided in the ward or municipality where they wish to vote for at least 28 consecutive days before the election. The elector must also be registered to vote to receive an absentee ballot. Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued*.

Making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail

Contact your municipal clerk and request that an application for an absentee ballot be sent to you for the primary or election or both. You may make written application to your municipal clerk for an absentee ballot in person, by mail, by fax, by email or at MyVote.wi.gov.

Your written request must include:

1. Your voting address within the municipality where you wish to vote
2. the address where the absentee ballot should be sent, if different from the address above
3. your signature
4. a copy of your photo identification*

The deadline for making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail is:

5:00 p.m. on the fifth day before the election, Thursday, November 3rd.**

*Voters who are indefinitely confined due to age, illness, infirmity, or disability may not be required to provide photo ID. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

** Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined, in the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

Voting an absentee ballot in person

You may also request and vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office or other specified location during the days and hours specified for casting an absentee ballot in person.

The first day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is Tuesday, October 25th.

The last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is Thursday, November 3rd.

No in-person absentee voting may occur on the day before the election. The municipal clerk will deliver voted ballots returned on or before Election Day to the proper polling place or counting location before the polls close on August 9th. Any ballots received after the polls close will not be counted.

SCHOOL CROSSINGS

Please be mindful of crossing guards and for all pedestrian traffic by marked crossings. Most children have little concept of danger and do not have fully developed peripheral vision and hearing. It is up to adults to be responsible drivers.

Major types of auto accidents involving children include:

1. Children darting out into street at corner or mid-block.
2. Vehicles turning left into the path of pedestrians.
3. Vehicles backing up in roadways, driveways, or parking lots.



Remember if there are children on the sidewalk the speed limit is 15 miles per hour in school zones.

WARNING SIREN

When severe weather occurs, you will hear a steady tone for three minutes. Upon early warning, volunteers will attempt to set the Warning Siren to a STEADY TONE. This warning is to inform you to seek information from TV or RADIO. For residents that do not have adequate shelter, the Lutheran Church, 207 University Street, has offered the use of the church basement. Every effort will be made to get the rear (south) doors opened on alarm. **YOU SHOULD MAKE ALTERNATE PLANS IN THE EVENT THE CHURCH IS NOT OPEN!!**

Having a plan in place will minimize confusion when time is of the essence. Preplanning to bring flashlights, possibly a blanket, as well as making other arrangements for pets will make for quick access to shelter. (Please do not bring pets to the Church).

This plan will be in effect immediately and until further notice.

“Weather Alert” radios are available for purchase at local electronics or major department stores. These units can be used in addition to the local warning siren for early severe storm alerts.

According to Dunn County Emergency Management, the siren is intended to alert people outdoors that severe weather conditions are nearby. The sounding of these sirens is your cue to access local detailed weather information from radio or television and discover if there is an need to take further action. More information can be found on their site: www.dunn.wi.co.us, click on Departments, Emergency Management & Outdoor Warning Sirens.

Dunn County Communications Center is responsible for testing the emergency siren system. The Emergency Warning Siren is tested the first Monday of each month at 10:00 a.m. from April through October. Standard emergency warning siren electro-mechanical tones are as follows:

- ALERT— Steady Tone, 3 minutes
- ATTACK—Wailing Tone, 6 sec. Hi/6 sec. Low, 3 min
- FIRE— Wailing Tone, 16 sec. Hi/8 Sec. Low, 4 Cycles
- GROWL- Short Burst, 2 Sec. Used for testing of siren only.

Notice to Residents: There is fine-ground mulch available at the solid waste site, just bring your truck/trailer and shovel!

TRICK OR TREATING SAFETY TIPS

Some important Halloween safety tips from Ready Wisconsin are as follows:

1. Never go alone—Children under the age of 12 should always have an adult with them. Children over the age of 12 should walk in groups or with a trusted adult.
2. Trick or treaters should only go to well-lit homes and never accept rides from strangers.
3. After dark, everyone in your group should carry a flashlight or light stick. Add reflective tape to costumes to help drivers see while walking along dark streets.
4. Watch the roads—Drivers should be on the lookout for trick-or-treaters walking on roadways and crossing the streets. Know when people will be out in your community and drive with caution when going through neighborhoods.
5. Check treats before eating—An adult should inspect all candy and other treats for tapering, choking hazards and potential allergens.

The Warning Siren will be Tested the first Monday of the month at 10:00 a.m., dates are as follows:

October 3, 2022
November 7, 2022
December 5, 2022

Siren will also sound on October 13th at 7:00 p.m. for Fire Safety Awareness!

Sec. 7-1-12 Animal Feces.

- (a) **Removal of Fecal Matter.** The owner or person in charge of any dog, cat, horse, potbellied pig, or other animal shall not permit solid fecal matter of such animal to be deposited on any street, alley or other public or private property, unless such matter is immediately removed therefrom by said owner or person in charge. The owner or person in charge of such animal shall, while on any street, alley or other public or private property of another with such animal, have within their possession the necessary equipment to immediately remove such fecal matter from the street, alley or other public or private property. This regulation is also applicable to farm animal waste transported through the Village. This Section shall not apply to a person who is visually or physically handicapped.
- (b) **Accumulation of Fecal Matter Prohibited on Private Yards.**
- (1) **Owner's Property.** The owner or person in charge of the dog, cat or other animal must also prevent accumulation of animal waste on his/her own property by regularly inspecting and properly disposing of the fecal matter.
 - (2) **Rental Property.** Any owner of property rented to others must insure tenants do not permit the accumulation of animal waste on the rental property by tenants regularly and shall inspect and properly dispose of fecal matter.
