The Elk Mound Police Department is committed to providing the best possible professional law enforcement services to all citizens and non-citizens through following best practices in policing, accountability, and reflecting the values of the first-class community it serves. The Elk Mound Police Department provides community policing, including patrol, investigation, and enforcement of Elk Mound Village Ordinances and applicable Wisconsin State Statutes, for the Village of Elk Mound.

The Elk Mound Police Department is establishing an eligibility hiring list for Police Officers. This list will encompass Part-Time Limited Term Employment Police Officer (less than 800 hours annually) and potential Full-Time Police Officer positions. Minimum Standards for candidates wishing to apply for this position include being a United States Citizen at least 18 years of age, possessing a valid driver's license with a good driving record, be in good physical, medical, and drug-free condition, have the ability to possess a firearm, possess a high school diploma or equivalent, possess a minimum of 60 college credits from an accredited higher education institution recognized by the United States Secretary of Education, will not hold any felony convictions or any domestic abuse-related convictions (or convictions of any other offense if committed in Wisconsin could be punished as a felony) unless the applicant has been granted an absolute and unconditional pardon, will have vision correctable to 20/20, will possess good verbal and written communication skills, will be able to react quickly and effectively to stressful situations, be able to work evening-nights-weekends and holidays in various Wisconsin weather conditions, have clear and concise speech, the ability to handle several tasks simultaneously, must be able to perform essential functions of this position including the ability to use all standard law enforcement equipment.

Preference will be granted to those candidates who have previous experience or are currently employed with a law enforcement agency within Wisconsin. Before hire, successful candidates will complete oral interviews and pass background checks, medical screening, drug screening and psychological screening.

Pay for Part-Time LTE Officers will start at \$15.00 an hour, with the opportunity for up to 20 hours per week. Part-Time LTE Officers will have preference for any potential future Full-Time Officer positions. Those who wish to apply will submit a resume, completed "Elk Mound Police Application for Employment," with signed and completed "Authorization for Release of Information and Liability Waiver" available at <http://elkmound.org/content/police>, to be received by Chief Chad Weinberger in person or email at the Elk Mound Police Department, before Thursday, March 31, 2022, at 2:00 P.M.
