Badger Books

In 2017, at the direction of the Commission, WEC staff developed an electronic poll book application for use in Wisconsin elections. Wisconsin statute requires authorization from the commission for the use of any electronic poll book in the state. To date, the Badger Book is the only electronic poll book authorized for use in Wisconsin and is the only e-poll book application with indirect WisVote integration. **Badger Books are not connected to the internet.**

The Badger Book is only an electronic version of the paper poll book and as such, performs only those functions. It is used to check in voters, process Election Day Registrations (EDRs) per Wis. Stat. 6.79(2)(c), and record absentee participation.

After Election Day, a data file generated from the Badger Book is used to upload election participation and Election Day Registration information into WisVote so voters may see their participation more quickly in MyVote. More information on Badger Books can be found at www.elections.wi.gov.

Register to Vote

Save time at the polling locations by registering to vote in advance of the election. Next election for the Village of Elk Mound is the Spring Election on April 2, 2024. Go to myvote.wi.gov, select the register to vote tab, and follow the instructions.

Register to Vote Deadlines for the Spring 2024 Election

March 13, 2024 - *Deadline to Register by Mail* - Your voter registration form, along with proof of residence must be postmarked to your municipal clerk no later than March 13, 2024.

March 13, 2024 - *Deadline to Register to vote online.* - Voters who are able to match their name, date of birth, Wisconsin Driver License or State ID number, and address with the Wisconsin DMV can register to vote online through March 13, 2024.

March 29, 2024 @ 5:00 p.m - *Deadline to Register in Your Municipal Clerk's Office*- Voters may register in-person in their municipal clerk's office during the clerk's business hours until 5:00 p.m. on March 29, 2024.

April 2, 2024 from 7:00 a.m.-8:00 p.m - Register to Vote at Your Polling Place- Voters can register to vote at their polling place on Election Day, April 2, 2024.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Abraham/Hahn moved and seconded a motion to approve the Village Board minutes of December 20, 2023. Motion carried.

<u>CITIZEN'S FORUM – (PUBLIC INPUT):</u> There was no one registered for Citizens Forum.

PUBLIC APPEARANCE: There was no public appearance.

APPROVAL OF GENERAL FUND AND WATER/SEWER UTILITY VOUCHERS

Report from Fire Board Representative

There were six calls for service this month, with a total of 82 calls for 2023. This is an increase from 2022, when there were 63 calls.

Colfax EMS Director Don Knutson is retiring from his position effective December 31, 2023. Fire District banking options are still being reviewed. The Board is working with Chief Fuester on an ordinance that will be adopted by all three municipalities for billing and collection of fees from extinguishing and clean-up of fires.

The Department received the equipment purchased with the DNR grant.

The decommissioning of Squad #2 is complete. The new squad addition has been put into service. A thermal imaging camera has been installed on Squad #3.

Department personnel continue to work on inspections and re-inspections.

BOARD MINUTES JANUARY 15, 2024

Report from Elk Mound/Colfax Solid Waste & Recycling

The unit has been working to inform residents that a new fee schedule for items that are not considered household garbage or recyclables has been updated. Vendors who will dispose of these items at the lowest cost possible are being located.

The unit is continuing to sell two sizes of clear bags at the Elk Mound Village Hall, Colfax Village Hall, and the two Solid Waste and Recycling sites. The unit is working with the Elk Mound and Colfax Public Works departments to plow and sand the sites to create a safe environment for residents and employees.

Colfax Rescue Squad Monthly Report

The Colfax Rescue Squad Monthly Report from December was reviewed. This is available in the Village Clerk-Treasurer's Office.

Community Center/Library Report

Terry Stamm reported that the Community Center/Library Board did not meet, but a meeting is scheduled for January 22 at 4:30 p.m.

Communications & Miscellaneous Business as Permitted by Law

Clerk/Treasurer Karin Wolf reported that a Village resident has expressed interest in submitting a referendum question regarding the use of fluoride in the Village's water supply. The resident would like to have this question added to the April ballot. The deadline to obtain the necessary signatures and submit the required paperwork is January 23.

Director of Public Works Mark Levra reported that the same Village resident requested several water sample reports showing the percentage of fluoride in the water supply.

Trustee Cynthia Abraham asked the Village Board and employees to decide on a new date for the Village Holiday Party. It will now be held on February 3.

Trustee Bob Bachman announced that the Menomonie Public Library is celebrating 150 years of library service in Dunn County this year. The banner also reads that there has been 10 years of library service in Elk Mound and the Menomonie Library Board is wondering if the Village would like to do anything to celebrate this milestone.

Trustee Pat Lien mentioned that the building at W321 Menomonie Street appears to be in disrepair.

President Terry Stamm reported that the Village attorney, Jason Brasch, will be attending the February 5 meeting to discuss the cell phone tower lease agreement, as well as the potential change to the number of meetings held per month. President Stamm also mentioned that Bowmar Appraisal will also be conducting a full re-evaluation of all of the properties in the Village.

VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may submit a request to vote an absentee ballot to their municipal clerk. A qualified elector is any U.S. citizen, who will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day, who has resided in the ward or municipality where they wish to vote for at least 28 consecutive days before the election. The elector must also be registered to vote to receive an absentee ballot. Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued*.

Making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail:

Contact your municipal clerk and request that an application for an absentee ballot be sent to you for the primary or election or both. You may make written application to your municipal clerk for an absentee ballot by mail, by fax, by email or at MyVote.wi.gov. Or you may apply in person at the clerk's office during the In-Person Absentee Voting period listed below.

Your written request must include:

- 1. Your voting address within the municipality where you wish to vote.
- 2. the address where the absentee ballot should be sent, if different from the address above
- 3. your signature
- a copy of your photo identification*

The deadline for making application to receive an absentee ballot by mail is:

5:00 p.m. on the fifth day before the election, Thursday, March 28th, 2024.**

*Voters who are indefinitely confined due to age, illness, infirmity, or disability may not be required to provide photo ID. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

** Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined, in the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

Voting an absentee ballot in person

You may also request and vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office or other specified location during the days and hours specified for casting an absentee ballot in person.

The first day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is Tuesday, March 19th. The last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is Friday, March 29th.

No in-person absentee voting may occur on the day before the election. The municipal clerk will deliver voted ballots returned on or before Election Day to the proper polling place or counting location before the polls close on April 2, 2024. Any ballots received after the polls close will not be counted.

WARNING SIREN

When severe weather occurs, you will hear a steady tone for three minutes. Upon early warning, volunteers will attempt to set the Warning Siren to a STEADY TONE. This warning is to inform you to seek information from TV or RADIO. For residents that do not have adequate shelter, the Lutheran Church, 207 University Street, has offered the use of the church basement. Every effort will be made to get the rear (south) doors opened on alarm. YOU SHOULD MAKE ALTERNATE PLANS IN THE EVENT THE CHURCH IS NOT OPEN!!

Having a plan in place will minimize confusion when time is of the essence. Preplanning to bring flashlights, possibly a blanket, as well as making other arrangements for pets will make for quick access to shelter. (Please do not bring pets to the Church).

This plan will be in effect immediately and until further notice.

"Weather Alert" radios are available for purchase at local electronics or major department stores. These units can be used in addition to the local warning siren for early severe storm alerts.

According to Dunn County Emergency Management, the siren is intended to alert people outdoors that severe weather conditions are nearby. The sounding of these sirens is your cue to access local detailed weather information from radio or television and discover if there is an need to take further action. More information can be found on their site: www.dunn.wi.co.us, click on Departments, Emergency Management & Outdoor Warning Sirens.

Dunn County Communications Center is responsible for testing the emergency siren system. The Emergency Warning Siren is tested the first Monday of each month at 10:00 a.m. Standard emergency warning siren electro-mechanical tones are as follows:

ALERT— Steady Tone, 3 minutes
ATTACK—Wailing Tone, 6 sec. Hi/6 sec. Low, 3 min
FIRE— Wailing Tone, 16 sec. Hi/8 Sec. Low, 4 Cycles
GROWL- Short Burst, 2 Sec. Used for testing of siren only.

ORDINANCE REMINDER WINTER PARKING

Per Sec. 10-1-29 (b) Winter Parking Restricted:

- (1) No person shall park a vehicle on streets or portions of streets within the Village of Elk Mound, between the hours of 3:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m., from November 1 through April 1, the snow removal season, except as follows:
 - a) On odd-numbered calendar days, on that side of the street with oddnumbered house numerals; and
 - b) On even-numbered calendar days, on that side of the street with even numbered house numerals.
- (2) In addition to the penalties of Section 10-1-50, Village officials may remove any such vehicle parked in violation of this Section to a place of storage and may charge the cost of towing and storage to the owner of such vehicle.
