MUNICIPAL BUILDING VILLAGE OF ELK MOUND

The October 21, 2024 meeting of the Board of Trustees for the Village of Elk Mound was called to order by Village President Terry Stamm at 6:00 p.m. in the Municipal Building.

Karin Wolf, Clerk-Treasurer, verified that proper notice of the meeting had been posted.

Roll call showed Bob Bachman, Tim Benjamin, Pat Hahn, Pat Lien, Joyce Price and Terry Stamm present. Cynthia Abraham was absent.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Price/Hahn moved and seconded a motion to approve the Village Board minutes of September 16, 2024. Motion carried.

CITIZEN'S FORUM – (PUBLIC INPUT)

Tom Gilbert expressed continued concerns regarding the addition of fluoride to the Village's water supply. He asked the Village to consider stopping this process.

John Nickolai stated that he also supports discontinuing the addition of fluoride to the Village's water supply.

PUBLIC APPEARANCE

Paul Mahler, Bakke Norman, introduced himself as the new Village attorney. He is looking forward to working with the Village's trustees and employees.

Report from Fire Board Representative

The Department responded to seven calls for service this month. The Department membership is currently 24 members.

Chief Fuester is working on ordinance changes for billing purposes. He is also working with their insurance company on updated replacement values for equipment. Engine 5 is still being repaired and painted as needed.

All of the second half assessments and 2% dues have been paid by the three municipalities. The second half of the year fire inspections will be conducted soon. A joint training with other Fire Departments was very successful.

Chief Fuester is recommending a banking switch to Independence State Bank. He is also currently working on the 2025 budget for the Department.

Report from Elk Mound/Colfax Solid Waste & Recycling

The R.U has completed the compensation adjustment effective for 2025. They are presently working on the 2025 per capita charges to the nine municipalities who are a part of the R.U. Work is continuing on the 2025 Colfax R.U. budget and they hope to have copies available soon.

Colfax Rescue Squad Monthly Report

The Colfax Rescue Squad Monthly Report from August was reviewed and is on file in the Village Clerk/Treasurer's office.

Community Center/Library Report

Terry Stamm reported that the Community Center/Library Board did not meet but is scheduled to meet on October 28 at 4:30 p.m.
