Chief Fuester is still working with the attorney on a billing ordinance to be adopted by the three municipalities. Repairs continue to be completed on Engine No. 5. The 2025 operating budget has been approved.

The second half of fire inspections for 2024 will begin soon. The Department received grants for a fire danger sign, education banner, six pails of Class A foam, and a battery-operated positive pressure ventilation fan.

A relief valve has been installed at Settlers Ridge apartments to reduce the number of false alarm calls.

## Report from Elk Mound/Colfax Solid Waste & Recycling

The R.U worked with R&R Waste Management to clean the culverts located at the Elk Mound site. They worked with the Cub Scouts to clean up the Elk Mound site to prepare for the DNR inspection, and also worked with Jenson Farms on yard waste removal at the site for proper composting as required.

The R.U. has begun selling 55-gallon clear bags at the request of R.U. residents. They are available at both the Colfax and Elk Mound sites at a cost of one dollar per bag.

The R.U. is asking residents to break down their cardboard boxes prior to coming to the sites to help the disposal process move faster.

# ORDINANCE REMINDER WINTER PARKING

Per Sec. 10-1-29 (b) Winter Parking Restricted:

- (1) No person shall park a vehicle on streets or portions of streets within the Village of Elk Mound, between the hours of 3:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m., from November 1 through April 1, the snow removal season, except as follows:
  - a) On odd-numbered calendar days, on that side of the street with oddnumbered house numerals; and
  - b) On even-numbered calendar days, on that side of the street with even numbered house numerals.
- (2) In addition to the penalties of Section 10-1-50, Village officials may remove any such vehicle parked in violation of this Section to a place of storage and may charge the cost of towing and storage to the owner of such vehicle.



## NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS VILLAGE OF ELK MOUND

The Dunn County Treasurer, 3001 US Hwy 12 East, Suite 102A, Menomonie WI 54751 will collect real estate taxes for the 2024 tax year on behalf of the Village of Elk Mound. Please make checks payable to Dunn County Treasurer. First installment of real estate tax is due January 31, 2025. Second installment of real estate tax is due July 31, 2025.

**Note:** Your dog licenses should be purchased from the Elk Mound Village Clerk/Treasurer, and you must provide proof of rabies vaccinations for the dogs.

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#### ORDINANCE REMINDER

Sec. 6-2-8 Snow and Ice Removal.

- (a) Removal From Sidewalks. Within twenty-four (24) hours after the cessation of any fall of sleet or snow, it shall be the duty of the owners and/or the occupants of any lot or parcel of land in the Village of Elk Mound to remove, or cause to be removed, the snow or sleet from any and all sidewalks and the nearest crossside-walks adjacent to the premises of such owner or occupant, and to keep the same free and clear of snow and ice for the full width of the sidewalk.
- (b) **Failure to Remove.** In case of failure or neglect of any owner or occupant of any land or parcel of land to remove the snow from sidewalks as specified in subsection (a) within the time set forth in said Subsection and, after twenty-four (24) hours after the cessation of any fall of snow, the owner or occupant has failed to remove such snow from sidewalks as specified in Subsection (a), the Public Works Department shall remove or cause the snow to be removed from any and all sidewalks and cross-sidewalks that may be so neglected by the owner or occupant, and a fee established by the Village Board shall be assessed against the owner or occupant for the cost and expense of moving such snow. The fee will be charged against the respective lots and parcels of land adjacent to which said work shall be done, as a special charge, and such sum or sums shall be collected in the same manner as other special taxes.

## ADOPT-A-HYDRANT PROGRAM

The Elk Mound Water Utility is asking residents and community businesses to adopt their neighborhood fire hydrants. They can do this by clearing accumulated snow around hydrants near their homes and places of employment.

Snow removal around the system fire hydrants is the responsibility of everyone, but during the winter storms, hydrants may become buried for sometime before utility crews reach all hydrants in the system.

Not all systems require utility personnel the sole responsibility to clear snow—but rely on street departments, fire departments and citizen volunteers. Please remember safety precautions must be followed. By taking a few minutes to clear your "adopted" hydrant, you'll be assisting both the water and fire departments. The house you save might just be your own!

- 2. Nearest Cross Street
- 3. Issue (Blinking Light, Light Not Operating, etc.)

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## WARNING SIREN

When severe weather occurs, you will hear a steady tone for three minutes. Upon early warning, volunteers will attempt to set the Warning Siren to a STEADY TONE. This warning is to inform you to seek information from TV, broadcast radio, or "NOAA Weather Alert" radio. For residents that do not have adequate shelter, the Lutheran Church, 207 University Street, has offered the use of the church basement. Every effort will be made to get the rear (south) doors opened on alarm. YOU SHOULD MAKE ALTERNATE PLANS IN THE EVENT THE CHURCH IS NOT OPEN!!

Having a plan in place will minimize confusion when time is of the essence. Preplanning to bring flashlights, possibly a blanket, as well as making other arrangements for pets will make for quick access to shelter. (Please do not bring pets to the Church).

## This plan will be in effect immediately and until further notice.

"NOAA Weather Alert" radios are available for purchase at local electronics or major department stores. These units can be used in addition to the local warning siren for early severe storm alerts.

According to Dunn County Emergency Management, the siren is intended to alert people outdoors that severe weather conditions are nearby. The sounding of these sirens is your cue to access local detailed weather information from radio or television and discover if there is an need to take further action. More information can be found on their site: www.dunn.wi.co.us, click on Departments, Emergency Management & Outdoor Warning Sirens.

Dunn County Communications Center is responsible for testing the emergency siren system April through October. Village of Elk Mound tests November through March. The Emergency Warning Siren is tested the first Monday of each month at 10:00 am and monitored by the Village of Elk Mound. Standard emergency warning siren electro-mechanical tones are as follows:

ALERT— Steady Tone, 3 minutes
ATTACK—Wailing Tone, 6 sec. Hi/6 sec. Low, 3 min
FIRE— Wailing Tone, 16 sec. Hi/8 Sec. Low, 4 Cycles
GROWL– Short Burst, 2 Sec. Used for testing of siren only.
